Spending time in the sunny outdoors has long appealed to people. Before heading out, though, it is important to use some form of sun protection for our skin. Using sunscreen is one of the best ways to protect our skin from the _____ 33 _____ rays of the sun. _____ 34 _____ popular type of sunscreen, called physical sunscreen, acts by scattering and reflecting the sun's ultraviolet (UV)

Most of us have felt a bit tired after having a big meal. Known as a food coma, this condition is much less serious than a true coma since its effects are 38 dangerous 38 long-lasting.

In order to understand how food comas work, scientists have performed a number of studies. Their findings indicate that eating a lot of food causes blood to be 39 away from the brain and toward the stomach to aid in digestion. The result of having less blood flowing to the brain is why we feel sleepy.

The sandbox tree is a large tree that is 43 to South America. It can grow up to 40 meters tall in the right conditions, and it's best to keep your distance because the sandbox tree can be quite dangerous.

The sandbox tree is covered in tiny spikes. These 44 thorns are a warning for humans and animals to stay away. In the past, native tribes in the Amazon rainforest used its sap to create poison for their 45. In modern times, the sap has been used to make tear gas, which can 46 cause blindness and breathing difficulties.

Moreover, though its fruits look like tiny pumpkins, when they dry, they will 47 and shoot lots of tiny seeds at 250 kilometers per hour in all directions. This force can cause serious injuries to anyone nearby. This is why sandbox trees should never be planted anywhere near people. However, the sandbox tree may not be a good choice for a 48 garden or public park, but the tree does have other uses. Besides being an interesting yet dangerous tree for experts to study, the sandbox tree has provided some positive benefits for modern medicine.

In a deck of cards, the Joker card stands out from the others. The history of the modern Joker card can be traced back to the 1800s. It was designed for Euchre, a card game that was popular among soldiers during the American Civil War. 49 This blank card became the highest trump card in the game. Card manufacturers quickly realized the potential of this additional card and began producing cards with images instead of leaving them blank. 50 Like the Fool in the Tarot, the Joker doesn't belong to any of the four major suits. Over time, the use of the Joker became more common. It was included in many other games, such as Poker and Spades.

Today, the two Joker cards still have an air of mystery about them. In pop culture, the image of the Joker has taken on many meanings. 51 With his green hair, crazy smile, and purple suit, the Joker from the comic book and movie

series represents madness and chaos. He carries out strange crimes just to cause trouble. In other tales, the Joker lies to trick people. This is how fools from medieval times behaved to please kings and queens. A Joker's big smile can also represent people who seem happy on the outside but are hiding their deeper feelings on the inside. 52 This represents how people's emotions can switch from one extreme to another.
